Confirmed Study Visit: Special Tribunal for Lebanon (STL)

The STL was established in 2009 by the UN Security Council to prosecute the people accused of carrying out the attack of 14 February 2005 which killed 22 people, including the former prime minister of Lebanon, Rafiq Hariri, and injured many others. It is the first international tribunal of its kind to deal with terrorism as a distinct crime. During the visit the participants will gain deeper insights into the structure and role of the STL and learn about the specific challenges this international tribunal faces when trying terrorists.



The study visit* will consist of briefings with each of the four organs of the Special Tribunal for Lebanon:

- Chambers
- The Office of the Prosecutor
- The Defence Office
- Registry

Depending on the schedule, there might be a possibility to attend a public hearing.

From 24 – 28 August 2015, the Asser Institute and the International Centre for Counter-Terrorism - The Hague (ICCT) are organising the **fifth Advanced Summer Programme on Countering Terrorism**.
